ON BEING A GODPARENT/SPONSOR IN THE CATHOLIC FAITH

CONGRATULATIONS! Someone has appreciated your faith enough to ask you to share that faith with them or with their child. The Roman Catholic Church values godparents/sponsors so much that you should be very clear about what your role of sponsoring someone for Baptism or Confirmation involves.

This is what Canon Law, the official law of the Church, states in Canons 872-874:

The one to be baptized is to be given a sponsor who will . . . help the baptized to lead a Christian life in harmony with Baptism, and to fulfill faithfully the obligations connected with it. To be admitted to the role of sponsor, a person must . . . have completed the sixteenth year, and must be a Catholic who has been baptized, confirmed and has already received the Sacrament of the most Holy Eucharist and leads a life in harmony with the faith and the role to be undertaken.

As you can see, being a godparent or a sponsor is far more than an honorary role. You will help the parents provide a living example of Christian life. In other words, you and the parents represent the Church to this person and he/she will know that they are not alone in the quest to know God and to do God's will.

Prayer and regular reception of the Eucharist and other Sacraments will help you best fulfill your role as a sponsor to this person. Being an active participant in your own faith will help you lead by example, not only for the candidate for this sacrament, but also for everyone around you.
